Our 12 local elementary and middle schools give each student a strong foundation in reading, math, arts, science and personal skills they will need to succeed in high school and beyond. We strive to provide outstanding education to all students, unlocking their highest potential and putting them on a path to success.

Maintaining High-Quality Teachers and Instruction

Great teachers are at the center of student achievement, especially in core academic and advanced programs in reading, writing, math, arts and science. Over the past few years, CUESD has experienced a high turnover of teachers due to the cost of living in the Silicon Valley. Dozens of highly-qualified teachers have left for more affordable areas. Without additional funding, CUESD may continue to lose great teachers.

Dedicated Local Funding For Local Schools

To protect quality education for our elementary and middle school students, the Campbell Union Elementary School District Governing Board is considering placing an up to \$98 per parcel measure on a future ballot.

If approved by of voters, a measure would:

- Attract and retain highly qualified teachers by keeping salaries competitive, and provide new teachers with adequate training and support.
- Sustain strong academic and advanced programs in reading, writing, math, arts and sciences.
- Ensure that every student is reading at their grade level.
- Provide support for students who are emotionally or academically struggling both at school and home to ensure that they do not fall behind.
- Provide special education and programs for students with special needs.



Keep class sizes as small as possible.

Strict Fiscal Accountability

A potential measure requires mandatory fiscal accountability, including:

- A citizen's oversight committee to ensure the monies are spent as promised.
- All of the revenue from the measure would be spent here in our local schools, it cannot be taken away by the state and funds will go directly toward improving education for our children.
- Senior citizens would be exempt from this tax measure.
